## Image

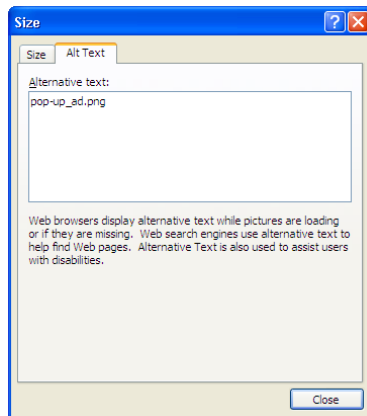


Figure 1: Dialogue to add alternative text to an image.
